4.1. Description of first aid measures

First-aid measures general

: May cause respiratory irritation. Inhalation of large amounts is expected to cause necrosis of tracheal epithelium, bronchitis and interstitial pneumonia by analogy to animal tests for tetrachlorogermane.

4.3. Indication of any immediate medical attention and special treatment needed

Note to physician: Organochlorogermanes react with water to form hydrochloric acid, consequently treatment for acid burns may be considered.

SECTION 5: Firefighting measures

5.1. Extinguishing media

Suitable extinguishing media : Water spray. Foam. Carbon dioxide. Dry chemical.

Unsuitable extinguishing media : Water.

5.2. Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture

Fire hazard

: Flammable liquid and vapor. Irritating fumes of hydrogen chloride and organic acid vapors may develop when material is exposed to water or open flame.

5.3. Advice for firefighters

Firefighting instructions

: Exercise caution when fighting any chemical fire. Use water spray to cool exposed surfaces.

Protection during firefighting

: Do not enter fire area without proper protective equipment, including respiratory protection. Avoid all eye and skin contact and do not breathe vapor and mist.


