ENVIRONMENTAL INFORMATION

Spill response: Utilize non-flammable absorbent, then sweep material and transfer to a suitable container for disposal.

HEALTH HAZARD DATA

SUGGESTED FIRST AID

INGESTION: Never give fluids or induce vomiting if patient is unconscious or having convulsions. Get medical attention.

REACTIVITY DATA

Stability: Stable

Conditions to avoid: Material decomposes slowly in contact with air by reaction with moisture, liberating methoxyethanol and boric acid. Avoid contact with water. Hazardous decomposition products: Organic acid vapors and boron oxide fumes, and methoxyethanol (ethyleneglycol, monomethylether).
